A Word From Our Pastor

I recently read this anecdote from a pastor in Kentucky:

It was nearing Christmas, and I received a phone call from a man who needed to talk to a counselor. I met him at my church office, where he told me his tale of woe. A decade earlier he had killed his wife in a fit of anger, was convicted of manslaughter, and spent several years in prison. He and his wife had a daughter who was in the custody of his in-laws. He had not seen her since the crime.

Now, as Christmas neared, his heart ached. Tears streaming down his face, he lamented, "I could pass her on the streets of this city and not even know who she was."

What I remember most about our counseling session, however, was what he said when he first walked into my office. Dramatically raising his arms, he said, "Now, preacher, let's just leave Jesus out of this, OK?"

As he sadly went his way that day, I thought to myself, *That's the whole problem. You've left Jesus out of everything.*

We can't control the world around us. Without fail, many people will continue to leave Jesus out of everything, to forget all but his name and the holiday that bears it. But let it not be so for us. In the retail world, this is the "holiday" season – a time for skyrocketing profits and major spending. For us, this is the "Advent" season. Advent simply means "coming." For these weeks throughout the month of December, we will celebrate Jesus' coming to us.

Let's not walk into this season, into our circumstances, or into our families and leave Jesus out of it. He came to show us a better way, a way to life and hope. He came to be near us, and to rescue us from despair, from corruption, and from ourselves. Jesus is coming. Let's let him in.


A love offering will be received.

Please let us know if you can help with any of these requests.


If you know of any company that can help us collect toys, let me know. I'd be happy to contact them and explain our ministry.


